### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### **CHISAGO COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH PRESENTATION**

Ann Norgaard, Chisago County Public Health Educator, gave a presentation to the Council regarding the role of the County's Public Health Agency. The mission of the Agency is to protect vulnerable citizens of the county and to provide opportunities for individuals to enhance their quality of life. This is done by providing services to them in an ethical, democratic and respectful manner through partnerships with individual citizens and with the community as a whole.

The Health Goals of the Agency are:

- Prepare for, respond to, and assist communities in recovery from disasters.
- Promote healthy communities and eliminate health disparities.
- Assure the quality and accessibility of health services.
- Prevent the spread of infectious disease.
- Make environments safe and healthy.
- Assure a strong public health system.

Public Health Priorities are:

1. Prevent obesity and illegal use/abuse of tobacco and drugs
2. Increase awareness and efforts to manage chronic disease including but not limited to cancer and diabetes
3. Increase Public Health visibility and awareness of what the Public Health Division is and does
4. Advocate for policy changes to serve underinsured and non-insured.

Norgarrd requested a contact person for future communications with the Agency as it continues to engage the public over the next few months with focus groups and discussions. Adam Berklund, Coordinator-Zoning Administrator will be that contact person. No other action was taken or requested.

#### **CONSIDER TAYLORS FALLS HISTORICAL SOCIETY SIGN PERMIT APPLICATON**

At the March 11, 2013 Council Meeting, the Taylors Falls Historical Society submitted an application to install a new visitor center sign on the Memorial Community Center. Questions and concerns were raised that if approved, would it set precedence for other organizations to request the same. Additionally, the primary intent of the Center is to memorialize veterans of Taylors Falls, not for use as a visitor center. Thirdly, the building has been designated as a Local Heritage Preservation Site, and signage such as this would contradict that designation. The issue was tabled then.

The Historical Society members decided to take a different approach by replacing the Folsom House sign located at the corner of First and Government Streets, with a new free-standing sign that advertises both the Visitor Center and the Folsom House. The proposed 54 sq ft hanging sign will be located closer to the building to avoid any traffic sight line issues. It will also offer a hanging six inch sign to advertise special events at the Community Center. Since the new proposed sign will not be attached to the building there is no need for a site alteration review. However, it will be installed on City property so approval must be granted by the Council. The Council was supportive of the new

location and the proposed multi-use of the sign. A permit from the County is not necessary since it is outside of their right-of-way.

MOTION BY RIVARD/TANGEN TO APPROVE A SIGN PERMIT FOR THE TAYLORS FALLS HISTORICAL SOCIETY TO INSTALL A FREE-STANDING 8' HIGH X 7'2" WIDE, 54 SQUARE FOOT VISITOR CENTER/FOLSOM HOUSE SIGN AT THE CORNER OF FIRST AND GOVERNMENT STREETS, REPLACING THE CURRENT FOLSOM HOUSE SIGN. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

**CONSIDER LIBRARY RECOMMENDATION FOR AWARD OF LIBRARY PAINT PROJECT**

The Library Preservation Project includes paint removal, the preparation of the wood for paint, and the actual painting of the building. The Library Board received two bids for this portion of the project, with a \$5,253.00 difference between the two. The Library Board members did not feel comfortable recommending either contractor, therefore recommended to extend the bidding period an additional two weeks and seek approval from the Council to allow the Library Board, rather than the City Council, to award the bid at a special meeting of the Library Board on June 12<sup>th</sup>. The Council had no objections.

The information was forwarded to the City Attorney for comment. It was his recommendation that the Council table approval and send the Binder back to the Heritage Preservation for further review, most specifically the Standard Operating Guidelines.

MOTION BY TANGEN/MURPHY TO TABLE APPROVAL OF THE TAYLORS FALLS HERITAGE PRESERVATION COMMISSION NEW MEMBER BINDER, UNTIL SUCH TIME THE STANDARD OPERATING GUIDELINE DOCUMENT HAS BEEN REVIEWED AND CLARIFIED AND/OR AMENDED. ONCE COMPLETED BY THE HPC, THE BINDER IS TO BE SUBMITTED ONCE AGAIN TO THE CITY COUNCIL FOR APPROVAL. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

**CONSIDER ANGLE PARKING ON RAVINE STREET**

Council Member Larry Julik-Heine reported the Highway 95 repaving project is nearly complete, and that Ravine and Government Street will be repaved within the next few weeks. Once this has been done, the City should reconsider the angle parking on Ravine Street, as it poses a safety hazard for those vehicles that turn onto Ravine Street, or those that are on Ravine Street and need to turn onto Bench Street. If angle parking were removed, three parking stalls would be eliminated, but could be

replaced by available parking behind the building that often times goes unnoticed. The Council was in agreement that while the City may lose parking it gains public safety. They also agreed that the owner of Romaine's on Main should be notified as a courtesy.

MOTION BY JULIK-HEINE/MURPHY TO ORDER THAT ANGLE PARKING STALLS ON RAVINE STREET SHALL BE REMOVED AND REPLACED WITH PARALLEL PARKING STALLS. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

**CONSIDER CONTRIBUTION TO INITIATIVE FOUNDATION**

Each year the Initiative Foundation requests a nominal contribution from the City, which the Council includes in its annual budget. The Initiative Foundation's mission is to work through and alongside Central Minnesota citizens to create healthy and sustainable communities. Taylors Falls has received more than \$35,000 in grants from the Foundation in the past.

On May 31<sup>st</sup> the Fire Department submitted the 2014 Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant prior to approval by the Council since it was to be postmarked by the June 1<sup>st</sup> deadline. The proposal is to purchase eleven pairs of bunker boots at \$269 each for a total of \$2,959.00. The grant is a 50/50 match, to be paid from the Fire Department's budget if awarded.

Mayor Buchite reported that the Council had conducted a second personnel performance evaluation earlier this evening for Adam Berklund, Coordinator-Zoning Administrator. Berklund submitted a certificate from Anoka Hennepin Technical College for a course he had recently completed to improve his writing skills. Council was in agreement that he had indeed made improvements.

**LIAISON OR COUNCIL MEMBER REPORTS**

**Ross Rivard** reported that the Planning Commission continues to review the Zoning Ordinances chapter by chapter for future amendments.

**John Tangen** reported that the Fire Department will be hosting a car show on Friday during Wannigan Days. The grant that was approved by Consent Agenda will be used to purchase bunker boots (if awarded).

**Larry Julik-Heine** reported that the Highway 95 improvement project is nearing completion. They will be concreting the inlaid manhole covers this week, adding a handicap ramp by the Drive In, and adding two new handicap stalls by the Catholic Church. Final striping will occur on June 14<sup>th</sup>.

The Summer Recreation program has been cancelled for 2013, due to scheduling conflicts with teacher Bob Zemlin. There wasn't enough time to consider a replacement, so the PRC was forced to cancel the popular program.

Julik-Heine also reported that Rivard Lawn Care will be providing mowing services this year, and Carson Eng has returned as the seasonal worker for Public Works.

**Mary Murphy** reported that a new member was appointed to the EDC and approved by Council tonight. Her family continues to help with painting at the Community Center. New knobs and handles will be installed as time permits. Blinds will be installed on the east windows in the stage area.

Murphy also reported that she is trying to organize a fund-raiser event for the Wannigan Days festivities, and is looking for volunteers to sit on a dunk tank. Mayor Mike offered to “bark” for the event.

**Mayor Mike Buchite** reported that the City was denied the University of Minnesota Tourism grant this time around. There were six times more applications than they expected. He also reported that the Senate had not passed the proposed New Business Jobs Development Zone which was approved by House Finance Tax Committee several months ago. In fact, the bill had not been introduced by Senator Sean Nienow for some unknown reason. This proposed language to the Omnibus Tax Bill, would have established a tax incentive for businesses that locate their business in the City’s new Business Park.

**A RESOLUTION ACKNOWLEDGING AUGUST 6, 2013 AS NATIONAL NIGHT OUT**

WHEREAS, The National Association of Town Watch (NATW) is sponsoring a unique, nationwide crime, drug and violence prevention program on August 6, 2013 entitled "National Night Out"; and

WHEREAS, the "30<sup>th</sup> Annual National Night Out" provides a unique opportunity for Taylors Falls to join forces with thousands of other communities across the country promoting cooperative police-community crime prevention efforts; and

WHEREAS, Taylors Falls residents play a vital role in assisting the Chisago County Sheriff's Department through joint crime, drug and violence prevention efforts in the City of Taylors Falls and is supporting "National Night Out 2013" locally; and

WHEREAS, it is essential that all citizens of Taylors Falls be aware of the importance of crime prevention programs and impact that their participation can have on reducing crime, drugs and violence in Taylors Falls, and;

WHEREAS, police-community partnerships, neighborhood safety, awareness and cooperation are important themes of the "National Night Out" program;
